- 4) Verification of proper notice: Chairperson Friday verified.
- 5) Approve agenda: Approval via unanimous consent.
- 6) Public comment (limited to 3 minutes per person with no time donations from others, agenda items only), start by stating name/address & agenda item(s) to be addressed: 1 heard- Julie Beyer asked why board is opening quotes for revaluation.

Supervisor Wortner joined meeting at 6:02pm.

- 7) Announcements: 3 of 9 informational sessions have been completed by Chairperson Friday. 6 additional upcoming meetings, residents encouraged to attend- 9/24/25 and 10/9/25 at 10am, 1pm, and 6pm.

- 5) Budget Workshop (the following may be discussed/acted upon in no particular order)

Apparatus and Equipment Status:

- Construction of our new fire engine is underway at Pierce Mfg. in Appleton with the cab already fabricated and sent to paint.
- Both fire engines passed their annually required pump tests that were conducted on site by Jefferson Fire Safety.
- Our new Maytag washer-extractor remains out of service pending warranty repairs.

Training:

- Chief Folgert and Asst. Chief Seils attended fire investigation training conducted by an agent from the DCI Fire Marshall's office.
- Last Monday evening's training drill was conducted at 180 Auto Towing and Recovery. Several vehicles and a school bus were used for extrication training. Nine firefighters participated.

Fire Prevention, Education and Community Involvement:

- Participated in the Peshtigo Historical Days parade with three trucks on Sept. 27th.
- Two students received rides to school in a fire engine as part of National Fire Prevention Week activities. Their names were drawn during Fall Family Funfest at The Forgotten Fire Winery on October 5th.
- No new requests received for free smoke alarms. These are still available to town residents.

Fund Raising & Donations:

- Tickets are still available for our Fall Sports Raffle to help with the purchase of equipment for the new fire engine. Ten prizes are available. Raffle tickets are \$20 each or six for \$100.
- TOPFD Supporter T-Shirts are now being sold for \$25 each to help raise funds for the purchase of equipment for our new engine.
- \$500 Donation received from Cans for Kids

- \$500 Donation received from Jill Bedwell in memory of her mother, Sheri Behnke.
- New Humminbird graph for our rescue boat was donated and installed by Lakeside Powersports and A & K Bait & Tackle.

Personnel:

- One firefighter has been removed from our roster due to inactivity over the past two years.
- One firefighter remains on light duty for several more months due to a non-work-related injury.
- Andrew Glaszcz has completed Entry Level Firefighter training through NWTC.
- Our roster is down to 20 volunteer firefighters. We are currently accepting applications.

Please accept this letter as my formal resignation from my contracted position of building inspector, effective end of day, October 31st, 2025.


I truly appreciate the opportunity to work with you and other Town Staff over the past couple of years. Please understand that this has been a difficult decision but is what is best for me and my family.


