- No motorized vehicles are permitted on trail




Trail Activities

- Cross-Country Skiing
 This trail is groomed for traditional skiing when possible.
- Snowshoeing
 Snowshoeing is allowed on and off the trail. Please stay off the ski track.
- Winter Hiking When snow conditions aren't great for skiing, one can hike the trail. Again, please stay off the ski track.
- This area is home to many wild animals. In the winter, wildlife tracks can be seen everywhere. Wildlife stations are located along the trail to help identify tracks and tell about the animals.

How To Get There

Take the Peshtigo Exit from Highway 41. Once on Business 41 in Peshtigo, go south on West Front Street (first street west of the bridge). This street eventually turns into Hale Road outside the city limits. After a few miles, turn left onto Harbor Road, then right onto Hale School Road. After about one half mile, the ski trail will be on the left. Parking is limited.





This trail is part of the Peshtigo Harbor Wildlife Area Trails Project. A partnership between Marinette County Land & Water Conservation, the Department of Natural Resources, and UW-Extension and a grant from the Wisconsin Coastal Management Program made this project possible.

The Peshtigo River Trail, completed in September 2004, is an 11-mile self-guided canoe trail on the Lower Peshtigo River. Hemlock Curve Nature Trail, completed in July 2005, is a 2.5-mile walking and interpretive nature trail. The Woods Road Ski Trail was completed in January 2006.
